

# PARTICIPATORY INITIATIVE TO PROTECT KEY MARINE ECOSYSTEMS IN ECUADOR

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## Galera-San Francisco conserves biodiversity with the support of local communities

This area features an outstanding variety of coastal and marine habitats including mangroves, estuaries, rocky reefs, and coral patches, with high levels of biodiversity.



Local residents are strongly dependent on natural resources for their subsistence, and artisanal fishing is one of their main activities.



The Galera-San Francisco area on the northern coast of Ecuador holds the last remnants of the Chocó-Darién-Tumbes-Magdalena hotspot and is part of the Eastern Tropical Pacific Seascape (ETPS), a regional marine conservation and sustainable development initiative led by Conservation International that supports transboundary marine management cooperation between Costa Rica, Panama, Colombia and Ecuador.

Galapagos has now a major counterpart on the mainland: Galera-San Francisco Marine Reserve, the only protected area of this kind on the Ecuadorian coast.
